REPORT ON AWARENESS PROGRAM ON DIGITAL CITIZENSHIP AND CYBER LAWS

Date: 13-06-2024

Date: 10 June 2024

Time: 10:00 AM - 12:30 PM

Venue: Shobhit University Campus

Introduction

An Awareness Program on *Digital Citizenship and Cyber Laws* was organized to equip participants with the knowledge and skills necessary for responsible and secure use of digital technologies. The session combined expert lectures, real-world case studies, and practical tips to underscore the legal frameworks, ethical considerations, and best practices that govern behaviour in cyberspace.

Objective of the Program

- To raise awareness about digital citizenship and cyber ethics.
 The program aimed to define what it means to be a responsible digital citizen by highlighting ethical norms such as respectful online communication and awareness of one's digital footprint. Participants were encouraged to reflect on how their online actions affect others and contribute to the broader digital community.
- To educate participants about cyber laws and legal protections.
 By examining the Information Technology Act, 2000, the session clarified the statutory provisions that address offenses like hacking, identity theft, and cyberstalking. This objective helped attendees understand their rights under the law as well as the legal consequences of cybercrimes.
- To promote safe and responsible use of the internet.
 The program provided practical guidelines on recognizing phishing attempts, using strong authentication methods, and safeguarding personal devices. Emphasis was placed on building habits—such as regular software updates and cautious sharing of personal information—that foster a secure online environment.
- To highlight the importance of data privacy and protection.
 Participants learned about principles of data minimization, consent, and the right to information under digital privacy norms. The session also discussed emerging

concerns—such as data breaches and surveillance—and how individuals can assert their privacy rights.

Key Activities

- Expert Session: Discussion on cyber laws under the Information Technology Act, 2000.A legal scholar specializing in IT law delivered an in-depth overview of the Act's key chapters, including sections dealing with unauthorized access, data protection, and intermediary liability. The expert illustrated how these provisions are applied in practice, citing recent judgments to demonstrate enforcement trends.
- Case Study Analysis: Examples of cybercrimes and legal interventions. Participants examined real incidents of phishing scams, social media defamation, and ransomware attacks to understand how cyber offenses are investigated and prosecuted. Each case was followed by a group discussion on how the law was invoked to deliver justice and what preventive measures could have been taken.
- Best Practices for Cyber Hygiene: Tips on securing personal data and avoiding cyber threats. A cybersecurity professional shared actionable advice such as creating complex, unique passwords; enabling multi-factor authentication; and regularly reviewing privacy settings on apps and social platforms. Attendees practiced configuring device security settings in a live demonstration to reinforce learning.
- Q&A Session: Addressing participants' concerns about digital safety. The floor was opened for students and faculty to ask questions ranging from safe online banking practices to identifying deepfake content. Experts provided tailored solutions, including recommending trusted tools for encryption and advising on when and how to report suspected cybercrime.

Outcomes of the Program

- Increased awareness of digital rights and responsibilities. Post-event feedback showed that participants gained clarity on their entitlements under the IT Act, such as the right to remove unlawful content and to seek restitution for data breaches. Many expressed newfound confidence in navigating the legal aspects of cyberspace.
- Improved understanding of cybersecurity measures. Attendees reported that the practical demonstrations helped demystify technical steps—like setting up VPNs or encrypting communications-and that they felt better equipped to defend against common cyber threats. Several participants committed to conducting regular security audits of their own devices.








Introduction



Outcomes of the Camp





REPORT ON SWACHH BHARAT ABHIYAN PARTICIPATION - LINKING CLEANLINESS TO CONSTITUTIONAL DUTIES

Introduction

A Swachh Bharat Abhiyan participation event was organized on Republic Day to foster the spirit of cleanliness and to emphasize its connection with the fundamental duties outlined in the Indian Constitution. REPORT ON CASE STUDY DISCUSSION ON LANDMARK SUPREME COURT JUDGMENTS

Date: 21.12.2023

Introduction

A Case Study Discussion on landmark Supreme Court judgments was conducted to deepen participants' appreciation of how judicial decisions shape India's constitutional landscape. The session focused on the analysis of pivotal rulings and their enduring influence on law, governance, and society.

Objective of the Discussion

- To understand the legal significance of landmark judgments. Participants were guided to
 appreciate why cases like the Kesavananda Bharati judgment are cornerstones of Indian
 constitutional law. By dissecting these rulings, attendees learned how judicial reasoning
 establishes binding precedents for future cases.
- To discuss the implications of Supreme Court rulings on governance and society. The session
 explored how judgments such as Maneka Gandhi's expansion of personal liberty impact
 administrative practices and legislative drafting. Discussions illustrated the ripple effects of
 judicial interpretations on policy-making and citizens' everyday rights.
- To encourage legal awareness among participants. Through active engagement with real
 judgments, students and faculty developed sharper legal literacy and confidence in navigating
 complex judicial texts. The goal was to foster a culture where informed citizens critically assess
 and apply constitutional principles.

- Case Study Presentation: Analysis of important judgments such as Kesavananda Bharati Case, Maneka Gandhi Case, and Vishaka Case. The facilitator introduced each case by summarizing facts, questions before the Court, and the final majority opinion. Detailed timelines and excerpts from the judgments helped participants follow the evolution of key legal doctrines like the Basic Structure, due process, and workplace harassment guidelines.
- Expert Commentary: Legal experts explained the judicial reasoning behind key rulings.
 A constitutional law scholar elaborated on the interpretive methods—textual, purposive, and historical—that the Court employed in these landmark cases. By comparing majority and

dissenting opinions, the expert illuminated how different judicial philosophies can influence the scope of fundamental rights.

- Group Discussions: Participants debated the impact of these judgments on constitutional rights.
 Small groups examined questions such as how the Basic Structure doctrine safeguards democratic values and the extent to which Maneka Gandhi broadened Article 21 protections.
 Each group then presented its viewpoint, highlighting tensions between judicial activism and restraint.
- Q&A Session: Open floor discussion on judicial activism and constitutional interpretation.
 The floor was opened for participants to question the role of the Supreme Court in policy-making and social reform. The experts addressed concerns about the balance between legislative intent and judicial review, using examples from the cases discussed.

Outcomes of the Discussion

- Improved understanding of Supreme Court judgments. Attendees left with a clearer grasp of
 how landmark rulings are crafted, including the procedural context, legal arguments, and
 societal motivations behind them. This enhanced comprehension equips participants to read
 and analyze future judgments independently.
- Enhanced legal literacy and awareness among participants. By engaging directly with primary
 texts and expert interpretations, students and faculty became more comfortable with legal
 terminology and judicial structure. Many expressed confidence in using these analytical skills
 in academic rese arch or civic advocacy.
- Encouraged informed discussions on constitutional law. The mix of presentations, debates, and Q&A fostered an environment where reasoned disagreement was welcomed and clarified. Participants committed to carrying forward these critical discussions into classrooms, study groups, and public forums.

REPORT ON BOOK REVIEW SESSION ON THE INDIAN CONSTITUTION

Date: 06.12.2023

Introduction

A Book Review Session on the Indian Constitution was organized to deepen participants' grasp of India's supreme legal text through critical engagement with authoritative writings. By examining diverse scholarly perspectives, the event aimed to bridge theoretical knowledge and real-world application of constitutional principles.

Objective of the Session

- To provide insights into the historical and legal aspects of the Constitution. Participants
 were introduced to the socio-political context in which the Constitution was drafted,
 including debates from the Constituent Assembly. This historical framing helped
 attendees appreciate how past struggles and philosophies shaped today's legal
 framework.
- To analyse key constitutional provisions through expert-written books.
 The session spotlighted works by leading constitutional scholars that dissect
 Fundamental Rights, Directive Principles, and the amending process. By comparing
 authors' interpretations, participants gained a multifaceted understanding of how these
 provisions function in practice.
- To encourage discussions on the relevance of constitutional laws in daily life.
 Attendees explored case studies drawn from the reviewed texts, relating them to contemporary issues such as freedom of speech, property rights, and social justice. This dialogue underscored the Constitution's continuing impact on governance, individual liberties, and societal change.

Key Activities

 Review of Selected Books: Participants and experts discussed books on the Indian Constitution. Three landmark texts—one historical overview, one legal commentary, and one contemporary critique—were assigned in advance. During the session, each book's central arguments, writing style, and relevance were evaluated, allowing participants to compare scholarly approaches.


- Analysis of Constitutional Principles: Key sections such as Fundamental Rights,
 Duties, and Directive Principles were highlighted. Experts guided the group through
 close readings of specific chapters addressing Articles 14-18 (Equality), Article 21
 (Life and Liberty), and Article 51A (Fundamental Duties). This activity clarified
 complex legal language and illustrated how these principles are interpreted by courts
 and policymakers.
- Discussion on Constitutional Evolution: Examination of amendments and landmark changes. The facilitator traced major amendments—such as the First Amendment (1951) and the 42nd Amendment (1976)—and their social-political drivers. Participants debated whether these changes strengthened or diluted the original vision of the Constitution, fostering critical reflection on constitutional adaptability.
- Audience Interaction: Open discussion on contemporary constitutional challenges.
 An interactive forum invited attendees to share questions about issues like digital privacy, anti-defection laws, and the balance between security and liberty. Experts provided legal context and encouraged evidence-based dialogue, highlighting the Constitution's role in resolving modern dilemmas.

Outcomes of the Session

- Enhanced understanding of the Indian Constitution. Participants reported a clearer grasp of both the document's text and its living interpretation through judicial review.
 The session demystified legal jargon and empowered attendees to read constitutional provisions with confidence.
- Inspired interest in constitutional studies among participants. Many expressed intents
 to explore further reading, enroll in constitutional law electives, or join campus forums
 on governance and policy. The diversity of book recommendations and discussion
 formats sparked enthusiasm for ongoing scholarship.
- Encouraged critical thinking on legal and democratic processes. By weighing differing
 viewpoints on amendments and case law, attendees developed analytical skills needed
 to assess how constitutional norms evolve. This intellectual engagement fostered a
 culture of inquiry, essential for informed citizenship and public debate.



REPORT ON PUBLIC AWARENESS RALLY ON VOTING RIGHTS AND ELECTORAL PARTICIPATION

Date: 26.11.2023

Introduction

A Public Awareness Rally was organized by Shobhit University students and faculty to encourage electoral participation and educate citizens about the importance of voting in a democracy. The procession wound through adjacent neighbourhoods, drawing attention to the vital role of each voter in shaping governance and policy.

Objective of the Rally

- To promote awareness about voting rights under the Constitution. The rally aimed to inform
 citizens of Article 326 of the Indian Constitution, which guarantees universal adult suffrage,
 ensuring every person over 18 has the right to vote. Organizers distributed pamphlets detailing
 the legal provisions and deadlines for voter registration to demystify the process.
- To encourage voter participation in elections. By demonstrating visible community support for
 voting, the event sought to inspire both first-time and habitual voters to turn out at the polls.
 Students carried placards urging passersby with messages like "Your Vote, Your Voice,"
 reinforcing the direct impact of participation on public policy.
- To educate people about the significance of informed voting. Alongside the rally, volunteers
 provided concise guides on evaluating candidates' manifestos, checking past performance, and
 identifying credible news sources. This component stressed that casting a ballot responsibly
 requires not only turning up but also making an educated choice.

- Rally Procession: Participants carried banners and slogans emphasizing voter awareness.
 Over 150 students and staff marched through the main thoroughfares, chanting slogans such as "Vote for Change" and "Democracy Begins with You." The colorful banners highlighted key messages about the power of the ballot and the duty of every eligible citizen to vote.
- Street Plays & Speeches: Highlighted the importance of free and fair elections. At designated stops, drama club members enacted short skits illustrating scenarios like vote-buying and electoral apathy, followed by faculty speeches on safeguarding electoral integrity. These performances engaged onlookers emotionally and provided concrete examples of why transparent elections matter.

- Voter Registration Assistance: Helped eligible citizens check their voter registration status.
 A team of volunteers set up mobile booths with laptops and internet access, guiding individuals through the National Voter Service Portal to verify or update their registration. This hands-on support removed technical barriers and ensured more people were ready to cast their ballots.
- Community Engagement: Encouraged discussions on electoral responsibilities.
 After the procession, small-group discussions were held in local community centers where residents shared voting-related concerns and experiences. Facilitators answered questions on polling procedures, accessibility for differently-abled voters, and the importance of protecting one's secret ballot.

Outcomes of the Rally

- Increased awareness about voting rights and electoral participation. Post-event surveys
 indicated that over 85% of participants felt more knowledgeable about their constitutional right
 to vote and the steps to register. Local residents who joined the walk reported a clearer
 understanding of election timelines and polling station locations.
- Motivated citizens, especially youth, to exercise their right to vote. Many first-time voters who
 interacted with the rally team pledged to register before the next election, citing the event as
 their primary motivation. Student organizers noted a spike in voter registration inquiries at the
 university's civic engagement office in the days following the rally.
- Strengthened democratic engagement at the community level. By bringing election awareness
 directly into neighborhoods, the rally fostered a sense of collective responsibility and civic
 pride. Several community groups expressed interest in collaborating on future voter-education
 drives, indicating a sustainable legacy beyond the single event.



REPORT ON INTERACTIVE SKIT ON FREEDOM OF SPEECH AND EXPRESSION

Introduction

An Interactive Skit on *Freedom of Speech and Expression* was organized to promote awareness of one of the most vital rights enshrined in the Indian Constitution. The skit used relatable and real-life narratives to explore the scope, challenges, and responsibilities that come with this fundamental right, particularly in a democratic setup.

Objective of the Skit

- To educate participants about the Right to Freedom of Speech and Expression. The event aimed







REPORT ON WORKSHOP ON RIGHT TO EDUCATION AND ITS IMPORTANCE

Introduction

A workshop on *The Right to Education and Its Importance* was held to inform and inspire students, educators, and community members about the crucial role of education in personal and societal development.  party members, opposition leaders, the Speaker, and cabinet ministers. They prepared for their
 roles in advance, researching parliamentary conduct and responsibilities to ensure an accurate
 and realistic simulation.
- Debate on Citizen Responsibilities: Issues such as voting rights, taxation, and social service
 were discussed
 The mock parliament featured structured debates on various civic issues including compulsory
 voting, the ethical use of public resources, tax compliance, and public service obligations.
 Participants demonstrated critical thinking, presented evidence-based arguments, and
 responded to counterpoints, simulating an authentic legislative dialogue.
- Legislative Process Simulation: Drafting and passing of a mock bill on responsible citizenship
 A mock bill titled "The Responsible Citizenship Promotion Bill" was introduced, debated,
 amended, and passed following a structured legislative procedure. This activity helped






participants understand the process of drafting laws, conducting floor debates, voting on bills, and the importance of consensus-building in a democratic setup.

- Increased awareness of the role of citizens in democracy. The session highlighted that
 governance is not just the responsibility of elected officials, but also of informed and engaged
 citizens. Participants recognized the importance of civic duties such as voting, paying taxes
 honestly, and contributing to national development.
- Encouraged active civic participation. The interactive format of the mock parliament fostered
 a sense of responsibility and motivation among students to participate more actively in civic
 life. Several participants expressed their intent to engage in student governance, community
 service, and democratic initiatives on campus and beyond.



 A panel of faculty judges evaluated the posters using criteria such as relevance to the theme,





Introduction

A community outreach program on Legal Rights Awareness was organized to empower individuals, especially from local communities, with knowledge about their legal rights and remedies. the importance of approaching the right legal channels without fear or hesitation.


Outcomes of the Program






Outcome






