Subject:- Grant of Yearly Permission to Kunwar Shekhar Vijendra Ayurved Medical College & Research Center, Adarsh Institute Area, Babu Vijendra Marg, Gangoh, Distt.- Saharanpur -247341, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID AYU0336) with intake capacity of 06 seats in 01 PG course in the subject namely (i) Kriya Sharir- 06 seats for the academic session 2025-26 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and Denial of permission in 03 PG courses with 18 seats in the subjects namely (i) Prasuti & Stri Roga - 06 seats (ii) Rachna Sharir- 06 seats (iii) Ayurved Samhita & Siddhant - 06 seats from the academic session 2025-26 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 -reg.

Sir/Madam,

1. To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Kunwar Shekhar Vijendra Ayurved Medical College & Research Center, Adarsh Institute Area, Babu Vijendra Marg, Gangoh, Distt.- Saharanpur -247341, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID AYU0336)** inspection was conducted on **20.03.2025 & 21.03.2025 on Hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process **the permission UG (BAMS) course and PG courses under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.**
2. Further, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Post-graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016", "Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate and Postgraduate Ayurveda colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals Regulations, 2024 and Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda Regulations 2024", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. **On careful examination of the assessment report it is found that your college is not fulfilling the notified & approved criteria and certain defects/shortcoming were found in the assessment report.**
3. **Further, an opportunity of clarification vide letter of even no. dated 05.07.2025 was provided to you. In response of the same, you have submitted the clarification vide ref no. KSVAMC/SU/737/2025 dated 09.07.2025.**
4. In view of above, the assessment report along with the submitted clarification was placed in the **135th Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on **18.07.2025**. On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein **the Board discussed and decided to provide an opportunity of virtual hearing to the college.** Accordingly, an **opportunity of virtual hearing was provided to your college** vide the MARB-ISM letter (Hearing notice) of **even number** dated **13.08.2025** to appear before the designated Hearing Committee on **18.08.2025**, to present their case and to show cause as to **why not the permission under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 be denied for the Academic Year 2025-26.**
5. The college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof to substantiate the claims against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions **vide letter no. KSVAMC/SU/737/2025, dated 15.08.2025** against the deficiencies conveyed to them. Whereas, the college through its representatives, **Dr. Krishna Nand (Vice Principal) and Dr. Vikash Sharma, Principal of the college,** appeared before the Hearing Committee on **18.08.2025** and

made their submission virtually as well as written, against the shortcomings communicated to the college.

6. Thereafter, the observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and the assessment report was duly placed before the **143rd Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on **26.08.2025** and **Board observed that the college is fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for the issuance of permission in UG (BAMS) Course. Further, the Board also observed that the college is meeting the notified & requisite criteria for the issuance of the extended permission as the college has been permitted for last three consecutive years with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) Course and eligible as per regulation 54(2) of Minimum essential standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals Regulations, 2024.**
7. Further, Extended Permission for 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2025-26 under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020 was issued to you vide letter of even no. dated 01.09.2025 and **Yearly permission for 02 PG courses with 12 seats in the subjects namely (i) Kayachikitsa- 06 seats (ii) Shalya Tantra- 06 seats** was issued to you vide letter of even no. dated 01.10.2025
8. It is informed that **Denial of LOP was issued for 04 new PG courses with 24 seats in the subjects namely (i) Prasuti & Stri Roga - 06 seats (ii) Kriya Sharir- 06 seats (iii) Rachna Sharir- 06 seats (iv) Ayurved Samhita & Siddhant - 06 seats for the academic session 2022-23 under section 29 of NCISM Act 2020.**
9. Further again, To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Kunwar Shekhar Vijendra Ayurved Medical College & Research Center, Adarsh Institute Area, Babu Vijendra Marg, Gangoh, Distt.- Saharanpur -247341, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID AYU0336)** inspection was conducted on **04.12.2025 & 05.12.2025 on Hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process **the permission UG (BAMS) course and PG courses for the academic session 2025-26 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.**
10. Further, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Post-graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016", "Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate and Postgraduate Ayurveda colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals Regulations, 2024" and "Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda Regulations 2024", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. **On careful examination of the assessment report it is found that your college is not fulfilling the notified & approved criteria and certain defects/shortcoming were found in the assessment report.**

Teaching staffs:-

- a) Yoga teacher is available.
- b) Bio-statistician is available.
- c) **Out of 47 teaching staffs, 20 staff was absent on the day of visitation.**
- d) **Total no. of teaching staffs rejected by the visitors is 10.**

For 04 PG Courses:-

11. In view of the above, it is decided to issue Yearly Permission in 01 new PG course with 06 seats in the subject namely **Kriya Sharir** and to issue Denial of permission in 03 new PG courses with 18 seats in the subjects namely **(i) Prasuti & Stri Roga - 06 seats (ii) Rachna Sharir- 06 seats (iii) Ayurved Samhita & Siddhant - 06 seats subject to ratification in the ensuing Board Meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM).**
12. Further, it is observed that the the **college is fulfilling the basic eligibility for issuance of Permission to start 01 new PG course with 06 seats in the subject namely Kriya Sharir** as the college is having 05 eligible teaching faculties (excluding excess) and **not fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission as per the Concerned Acts and regulations to start 03 new Post graduate course with 18 seats in the subjects namely i) Prasuti & Stri Roga - 06 seats (ii) Rachna Sharir- 06 seats (iii) Ayurved Samhita & Siddhant - 06 seats. Due to following reasons-**

As per sub regulation 1 of regulation 16 of (PG Ayurveda Education) Regulation 2016, The teacher-student ratio shall be such that the number of post-graduate teachers to the number of post-graduate students admitted per year is maintained as 1:3 in case of Professor and 1:2 in case of Reader or Associate Professor and as per sub regulation 2 of regulation 16 of (PG Ayurveda Education) Regulation 2016 the teacher student ratio shall be 1:1 in case of Lecturer or Assistant Professor having minimum of five years teaching experience.

As per sub regulation (7) of Regulation 6 of PG MSR Ayurveda 2016, the minimum additional teaching staff required for starting post-graduate course shall be one Professor or Reader and one Lecturer of the concerned subject, in addition to the teachers stipulated for under-graduate teaching, and the specialty which does not exist as independent department at under-graduate level shall have minimum one Professor or Reader and one Lecturer for starting post-graduate course.

As per sub regulation (8) of Regulation 6 of PG MSR Ayurveda 2016, the post-graduate department or specialty shall have minimum one Professor in concerned subject or specialty from the academic session 2017-18.

In the Department of Ayurveda Samhita and Siddhant- As, college is having 05 eligible teaching faculties (excluding excess) (01 Professor, 01 Associate Professor & 02 Assistant Professor for UG course and 01 Assistant Professor for PG course) and **there is non-availability of 01 Professor in the concerned subject which is mandatory as per sub regulation (8) of regulation 6 of (PG Ayurveda Education) Regulation 2016 and is not fulfilling the criteria for issuance of permission to start new PG course in the department of Ayurveda Samhita and Siddhant.**

In the Department of Prasuti Tantra & Stri Roga - As, college is having 03 eligible teaching faculties (excluding excess) (01 Professor, 01 Assistant Professor for UG course) and **there is non-availability of 01 Additional Higher Faculty in the concerned subject which is mandatory as per sub regulation (7) of regulation 6 of (PG Ayurveda Education) Regulation 2016 and is not fulfilling the criteria for issuance of permission to start new PG course in the department of Prasuti Tantra and Stri Roga.**

In the Department of Rachna Sharir - As, college is having 03 eligible teaching faculties (excluding excess) (01 Professor, 01 Assistant Professor for UG course and 01 Assistant Professor for PG course) and **there is non-availability of 01 Professor in the concerned subject which is mandatory as per sub regulation (8) of regulation 6 of (PG Ayurveda Education) Regulation 2016 and is not fulfilling the criteria for issuance of permission to start new PG course in the department of Rachna Sharir.**

13. Accordingly, it is decided as follows:-

- a) To issue Yearly permission with intake capacity of 06 Seats in 01 PG course in the subject namely i) Kriya Sharir - 06 seats in accordance with Sub Regulation 1 of Regulation 16 of (PG Ayurveda Education) Regulation 2016, Sub Regulation (7) of Regulation 6 of PG MSR Ayurveda 2016, Sub regulation (8) of Regulation 6 of PG MSR Ayurveda 2016, Regulation 15(7) of NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations 2024, as per the provision under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020, for the academic session 2025-26.
- b) Denial of permission with an intake capacity of 18 seats in 03 PG courses in the subjects namely (i) Prasuti & Stri Roga - 06 seats (ii) Rachna Sharir- 06 seats (iii) Ayurved Samhita & Siddhant - 06 seats as per section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 from the academic session 2025-26.

"DECISION"

14. Therefore, Kunwar Shekhar Vijendra Ayurved Medical College & Research Center, Adarsh Institute Area, Babu Vijendra Marg, Gangoh, Distt.- Saharanpur -247341, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID AYU0336) is hereby granted with:-

- a) Yearly permission with intake capacity of 06 Seats in 01 PG course in the subject namely i) Kriya Sharir - 06 seats in accordance with Sub Regulation 1 of Regulation 16 of (PG Ayurveda Education) Regulation 2016, Sub Regulation (7) of Regulation 6 of PG MSR Ayurveda 2016, Sub regulation (8) of Regulation 6 of PG MSR Ayurveda 2016, Regulation 15(7) of NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations 2024, as per the provision under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020, for the academic session 2025-26.

15. The aforementioned Permission is issued under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that following requirements shall be fulfilled:-

- I. It is informed that minimum **15% of postgraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 06 Seats in 01 PG courses** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
- II. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no.BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.

16. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.

17. Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**

18. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.

19. **You are hereby instructed to comply with all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the Implementation letters vide. ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS. Dated 09.05.2024 & 06.09.2024 issued by the Board.**

20. **The following requirements must be fulfilled and the compliance report must reach the Board by 31st December, 2025 to be considered for the issuance of permission for the academic session 2026-2027:-**

- i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
- ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations, 2024.
- iii) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Postgraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
- iv) All the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Post-graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016.

21. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.

22. However, concerned act does not prevent any college whose application/s has not been approved by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board to submit a fresh scheme for the permission of Medical Assessment and Rating Board in subsequent year in accordance with the schedule prescribed for receipt and processing of the applications under concerned. Hence, the applicant may apply afresh for the subsequent academic session.
