Subject:- Grant of Extended Permission to Kunwar Shekhar Vijendra Ayurved Medical College & Research Center, Adarsh Institute Area, Babu Vijendra Marg, Gangoh, Distt.- Saharanpur -247341, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID AYU0336) with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2025-26 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 -reg.

Sir/Madam,

1. To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Kunwar Shekhar Vijendra Ayurved Medical College & Research Center, Adarsh Institute Area, Babu Vijendra Marg, Gangoh, Distt.- Saharanpur -247341, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID AYU0336)** inspection was conducted on **20.03.2025 & 21.03.2025 on Hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process **the permission with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and PG courses under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.**
2. Further, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely the Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate and Postgraduate Ayurveda colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals Regulations, 2024 and Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda Regulations 2024", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. **On careful examination of the assessment report it is found that your college is not fulfilling the notified & approved criteria and certain defects/shortcoming were found in the assessment report.**
3. **Further, an opportunity of clarification vide letter of even no. dated 05.07.2025 was provided to you . In response of the same you have submitted the clarification vide ref no. KSVAMC/SU/737/2025 dated 09.07.2025.**
4. In view of above, the assessment report along with the submitted clarification was placed in the **135th Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on **18.07.2025**. On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein **the Board discussed and decided to provide an opportunity of virtual hearing to the college.** Accordingly, an **opportunity of virtual hearing was provided to your college** vide the MARB-ISM letter (Hearing notice) of even number dated **13.08.2025** to appear before the designated Hearing Committee on **18.08.2025**, to present their case and to show cause as to **why not the permission under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 be denied for the Academic Year 2025-26.**
5. The college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof to substantiate the claims against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions **vide letter no. KSVAMC/SU/737/2025, dated 15.08.2025** against the deficiencies conveyed to them. Whereas, the college through its representatives, **Dr. Krishna Nand (Vice Principal) and Dr. Vikash Sharma, Principal of the college,** appeared before the Hearing Committee on **18.08.2025** and

made their submission virtually as well as written, against the shortcomings communicated to the college.

6. Thereafter, the observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and the assessment report was duly placed before the **143rd Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on **26.08.2025** and Board observed that the college is fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for the issuance of permission in UG (BAMS) Course. Further, the Board also observed that the college is meeting the notified & requisite criteria for the issuance of the extended permission as the college has been permitted for last three consecutive years with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) Course and eligible as per regulation 54(2) of Minimum essential standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals Regulations, 2024. Accordingly, the Board decided as follows:-

- a) To issue extended permission with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and in accordance with Regulation 54 (2) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024 as per the provision under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020, for the academic session 2025-26.

"DECISION"

7. Therefore, Kunwar Shekhar Vijendra Ayurved Medical College & Research Center, Adarsh Institute Area, Babu Vijendra Marg, Gangoh, Distt.- Saharanpur -247341, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID AYU0336) is hereby granted with:-
 - a) Extended permission with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) for the academic session 2025-26 in accordance with Regulation 54 (2) Minimum essential standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals Regulations, 2024.
8. The aforementioned Permission is issued under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that following requirements shall be fulfilled:-
 - I. It is informed that minimum **15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 100 seats** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
 - II. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no.BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
9. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
10. Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
11. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
12. You are hereby instructed to comply with all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the Implementation letters vide. ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS. Dated 09.05.2024 & 06.09.2024 issued by the Board.

13. The following requirements must be fulfilled and the compliance report must reach the Board by 31st December, 2025 to be considered for the issuance of permission for the academic session 2026-2027:-

- i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
- ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
- iii) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.

14. In case if you are not satisfied with the decision of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM, you may prefer an appeal addressed to the Chairman, NCISM, within 15 days of issuance of the letter as per Regulation 65 of MESAR 2024 and Regulation 29(5) of NCISM Act 2020.

15. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.
